Today's English for football is – **relegation zone**

To be **relegated** means to drop down a division. At the moment, Watford are at the bottom of the Premier League and they look like they will drop down to the Championship (the old Second Division). **Relegation zone** is a phrase we use to describe the bottom group of teams who are in danger of being **relegated**. In the Premier League at the moment Middlesboro and Sheffield United are just above the **relegation zone** and have a big game this week.
